Global Outreach Updates





Ukraine, Europe

SpineHope's inaugural surgical trip to Ukraine (October 7–13, 2019) was a considerable success. Our volunteer team worked closely with host surgeons, Dr. Igor Kurilets and Dr. Igor Kurilets Sr. (from the International Neurosurgery Center in Kiev), and with nonprofits Razom for Ukraine and the National Foundation for Scoliosis in Ukraine, to lay the initial groundwork for a pediatric spine program for Ukrainian children suffering from complex spine and neurological conditions.

Our team was embraced at the Stryi Central District Hospital. Together we evaluated more than 60 patients, performed surgery on our first approved patients, helped direct post-operative care, and provided training and education to surgeons, medical staff, and students on advanced surgical techniques and spine safety protocols.
